


## OPENING HYMN: What a friend we have in Jesus TIS 590

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith


Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

In todays gospel, the disciples ask Jesus to teach them how to pray. It's a humble and beautiful request—an acknowledgment that prayer is not just instinctive but something astor's Desk that must be learned, practiced, and shaped by faith.

Jesus responds by giving them the Lord's Prayer, a model that is both simple and profound. It starts with "Father", reminding us that prayer begins with relationship. We approach God not as strangers or beggars, but as beloved children. The rest of the prayer balances two key dimensions of faith: reverence for God's holiness ("hallowed be your name") and trust in His provision ("give us each day our daily bread"), forgiveness, and guidance.

But Jesus doesn't stop with the prayer itself. He follows it with a parable about a persistent friend knocking at midnight, asking for bread. The message is clear: God welcomes our persistence. Not because He is reluctant to help, but because persistence deepens our trust and reveals our dependence on Him. The key takeaway is not that we must wear God down with repetition, but that we can approach Him boldly and confidently, trusting in His love and generosity.

Jesus concludes with powerful encouragement: "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened."

This is not a blank cheque for any desire, but a promise that God hears and answers prayer, often in ways that form us, stretch us, and bless us more deeply than we expect. Especially striking is verse 13: "How much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!"

In other words, the greatest gift of prayer is not just getting what we want—but receiving more of God Himself. The Holy Spirit is the answer to our deepest needs and longings.
