

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith


Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

In todays' two parables, Jesus teaches us about prayer—but from two very different angles.

The first story is about a widow who refuses to give up. She keeps coming to an

unjust judge, pleading for justice. Though he doesn't care about God or people, her persistence wears him down. Jesus uses this to contrast God with the judge: if even an unjust man will finally listen because of persistence, how much more will a loving God respond to the cries of his people.

Prayer, then, is not about convincing God but about persevering in trust, even when answers seem delayed. Faith keeps knocking, confident that God hears.

The second parable turns the spotlight inward. Two men go to the temple to pray: one a Pharisee, confident in his own righteousness; the other a tax collector, painfully aware of his need for mercy. The Pharisee's prayer is really selfcongratulation. He trusts in himself, not in God. The tax collector stands far off, beats his breast, and says, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." Jesus tells us that it is this humble, repentant man who goes home justified.

Together, these parables remind us that true prayer requires both persistence and humility. God delights in those who keep seeking him, not out of pride, but from a heart that knows its need.

May we learn to pray like the widow—steadfast in faith—and like the tax collector—humble before God. For the one who humbles themselves will be exalted, and the one who trusts in God will never be ignored.
