

On this Fourth Sunday of Advent, we light the final candle—the candle of Love. Its warm glow reminds us that at the very heart of Christmas is a God who chooses to come close, not with power or spectacle, but with love made flesh.

In today's Gospel, we encounter Mary, whose entire life becomes a witness to this love. When she hears God's invitation, she does not fully understand it, yet she responds with trust: "Let it be done to me according to your word."

Her “yes” opens the door for Christ to enter the world. Mary shows us that love is not merely a feeling; it is a willing response to God, a surrender to His plan, and an openness to His presence.

As Advent draws to a close, we are invited to make our own “yes” to God. To welcome Him into the places we guard too closely. To allow His love to transform our fears, heal our wounds, and soften what has grown hard in us. To let Him be born again in our hearts.

Love is the greatest of all the Advent gifts because it is the very nature of God. It is the love that moved Him to send His Son. The love that wrapped itself in human frailty in Bethlehem. The love that comforts, forgives, restores, and remains.

This final candle challenges us, too:

- to love those who are difficult to love,
- to reconcile where there is division,
- to give generously and humbly,
- to see Christ in the overlooked and forgotten.

Every act of love prepares a manger for Christ in our world.

As we approach Christmas, let this candle remind us that we are loved beyond measure and called to share that love without hesitation. God is not distant. He draws near—Emmanuel, God with us—and His love is the light that no darkness can overcome.

May we carry that love into these final days of Advent and into the celebration of Christ’s birth.
